

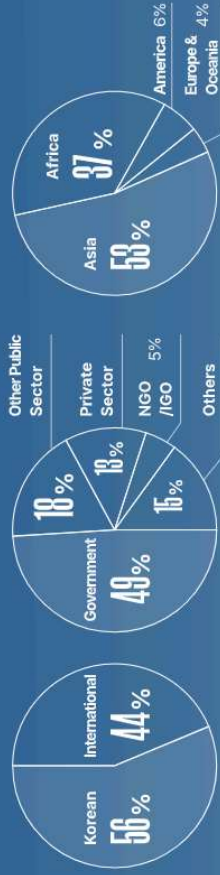
KDI School

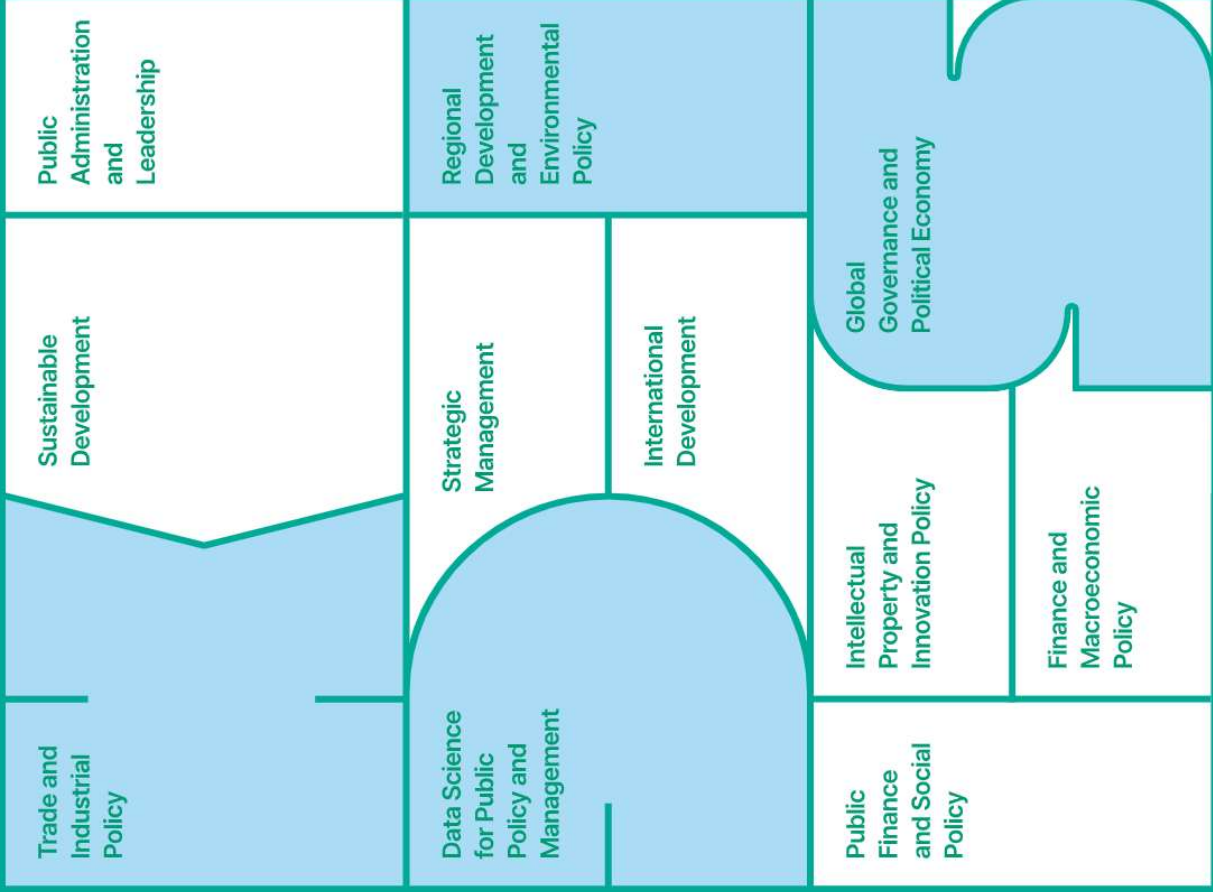

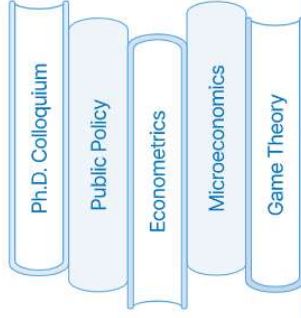

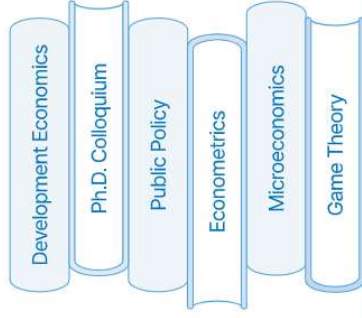
