▪ Choose Your School & Program

Each university or college offers insights into program offerings, eligibility criteria, and scholarship information. ▪ Explore Financial Aid Options

▪ Submit Your Application

Once you've chosen a program, follow the application guidelines and deadlines to submit your application package to the university or college directly. Reach out to the each institution should you need any assistance.



▪ Secure Your Visa

Visa requirements often include proof of admission, financial statement, and health certificate. Processing times vary, so it's advisable to apply well in advance. You can find information on visa requirements on the National Immigration Agency (NIA) website.

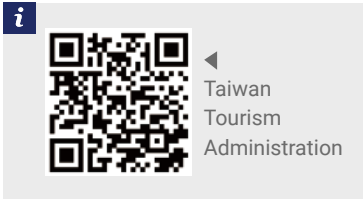

Embarking on an academic journey in Taiwan is an exciting prospect. The following guide offers some essential aspects of living in Taiwan.

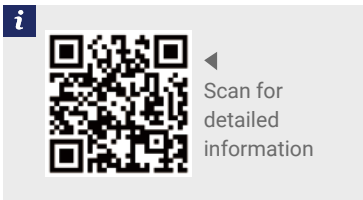
Taiwan Essentials & Exploration Guide

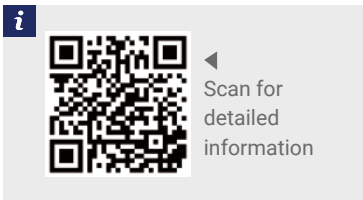
Visa

Choose your visa based on study program duration. Consult your institution and visit the Overseas Education Divisions for guidance.



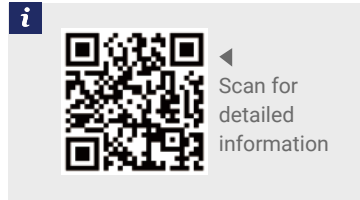
Housing

Most institutions in Taiwan provide on-campus dorms for convenient and safe housing. For details, inquire with your chosen school. Off-campus options are abundant, with rental platforms catering to various needs. Seek guidance from your university for insights on trusted rental services.



Medical Care

Upon your arrival, the Office of International Affairs at your chosen school will assist you in obtaining health insurance. Over-the-counter and prescription medications are easily accessible, and a network of widespread medical facilities, clinics, and hospitals offers specialized and emergency care. University staff help students to navigate the healthcare system, providing assistance when needed.



Banking Service

Local banks in Taiwan offer a range of financial services for foreigners. It is advisable to visit a nearby bank and inquire about the availability of bilingual Chinese and English services at specific branches.



Host Family

If you are interested in a culturally immersive experience, look into the LMMF Program (Light a Match Meet a Family.) They offer international students an opportunity to be part of a Taiwanese family during their stay.
