ATTENTION

This Call is open to all students, including those who enroll in a.y. 2026/2027 in Milano-Bicocca for the filter semester of **single-cycle master's degree programmes in "medicina e chirurgia" and "odontoiatria e protesi dentaria"**, pursuant to Ministerial Decrees n. 418 of 05-30-2025, n. 431 of 06-20-2025 and n. 447 of 11-07-2025. Later another announcement will be published on the unimib.it website, with the extension of the deadlines exclusively for students who, having attended the filter semester at a different university, decide to enroll at Milan-Bicocca in the second semester: these students, to request the DSU benefits, will have to be in possession of an ISEE 2026 for university purposes.

DEADLINE AND PROCEDURE FOR SUBMITTING APPLICATIONS

1. DEADLINES

The **scholarship** application (with any related integration for disability) must be submitted without exception **from July 7 to September 30 2026**.

The application for the **Housing Service** must be submitted **from July 7 to August 20 2026**.

The application for the Exceptional Subsidy, the Canteen Service and the integration for international mobility must be submitted **from July 7 to April 30 2027**.

No extensions will be allowed, considering the telematic procedure of presentation of the application.

NB: the above-mentioned deadlines are also valid for students who enroll in a.y. 2026/2027 in Milano-Bicocca for the filter semester of single-cycle master's degree programmes in "medicina e chirurgia" and "odontoiatria e protesi dentaria", pursuant to Ministerial Decrees n. 418 of 05-30-2025, n. 431 of 06-20-2025 and n. 447 of 11-07-2025. Later another announcement will be published, with the extension of the deadlines exclusively for students who, having attended the filter semester at a different university, decide to enroll at Milan-Bicocca in the second semester.

Students must notify to Fees and Funding Sector (Student Services) any event concerning the Scholarship that occurred after the submission of the application (*obtaining a different scholarship or other economic help, transfer to another University, inability to continue studies, withdrawal from enrollment, obtaining an accommodation place at another facility, change or end of the lease contract etc.*), within 15 days after that event and in writing.

Any changes in the already declared marital status or composition of the household of the applicant will be considered valid if occurred and communicated to the University by the deadline scheduled for the request of each benefit.

2. APPLICATION PROCEDURES

To submit the application the student does not need to be enrolled in the academic year 2026/2027, but the enrollment must be completed by the date of publication of the final rankings.

The student must submit the application by using the right to self-certification according to the D.P.R. 445 of 28 December 2000. Applications must be submitted using "[Sportello online](#)", available on the university website at this link:

To access "[Sportello online](#)" the student must be in possession of the University credentials. In the absence of that, the student must register to Online Student Registry (Student Services Online) on:

Students who intend to take part in an international mobility programme in the academic year 2026/2027 can apply for the Integration of the Scholarship together with the scholarship application.

International students who are not yet in possession of an Italian fiscal code, in order to submit their application must first obtain this document through the Italian Revenue Agency or through a request to the Italian Embassy in their country of origin.

According to the student's application, it may be necessary to provide additional documentation by uploading it on "[Sportello online](#)",

In the days following the upload of the document, an evaluation email will be sent to the applicant. In case of incorrectness (evaluation "non conforme") of one or more documents, it is necessary to upload on "[Sportello online](#)" the correct documentation within the deadline, according to the instructions of the email.

After the submission of the application, in the following cases it will be necessary to reconnect to "[Sportello online](#)" to complete the previous declarations:

- By October 10 2026: confirmation of the completion of the internship exam by September 30 2026 and declaration of the achieved weighted average, for students enrolled in the first and second level degree programmes of the Faculty of Medicine and Surgery (with the exception of the single-cycle master's degree programmes);
- from October 1 2026 to March 31 2027: declaration of any double enrollment (enrollment in two different degree programmes in the same academic year).

Failure to submit a document within the prescribed deadline or the presentation of an irregular document will cause the exclusion of the student from the present Call.

SCHOLARSHIP

(vedi [Deadline and procedure for submitting the application](#))

1. COMPOSITION OF THE SCHOLARSHIPS

The scholarship provided consists of:

- a monetary component;
- a component in the form of free canteen service;
- a component in the form of a full exemption from tuition fees (*50% exemption for students receiving a partial benefit. Please note that the regional tax for the right to education and the stamp duty must be paid by all students*).

Eligible non-beneficiary students are entitled to the exemption from tuition fees and the refund of the regional tax.

Additional benefits may be requested for international mobility and for students with disabilities (see [point 6](#)).

2. GENERAL CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION

The contest is open to students with Italian citizenship, students with citizenship of the European Union, and students with citizenship of non-UE countries referred to in D.P.R. of August 31st 1999, n. 394, implementing Legislative Decree of July 25th 1998, n. 286.

To participate in the contest students must be enrolled or must declare their intention to enroll in one of the courses listed in the table below. It is not necessary to be enrolled at the time of application.

The student must enroll in a regular academic year or (for first and second level degrees only) in an academic year outside prescribed time after the regular study course. Students with a disability of 66% or more (or pursuant to article 3, paragraph 1 or 3, of the law n. 104) can apply for a scholarship up to the second year outside prescribed time.

The scholarship benefit is granted only for the first qualification obtained at each study level in the following ways:

In order to be eligible for the scholarship, students must meet all the merit, economic and academic regularity requirements specified in points 3 and 4. There are no scholarships assigned solely for merit requirements or solely for the economic requirements.

3. MERIT REQUIREMENTS

3.1. General requirements

Students must be regularly enrolled in the academic year 2026/2027 on the date of the publication of the final rankings and must meet the requirements specified below.

Note: if the academic career is formally closed with the award of the degree before the publication of the final ranking, the student will not be eligible or will be excluded from the benefit.

3.1.1. Grounds for exclusion

In any case, the exclusion from the benefit applies to students who in the academic year 2026/2027:

- have already obtained, by the date of publication of the final ranking, a qualification of the same or higher level than the course of study for which the scholarship is sought in a.y. 2026/2027, whether obtained in Italy or abroad. If the qualification has been obtained abroad, the level will be considered regardless of its official recognition in Italy;
- are beneficiaries of a scholarship (or a similar contribution, obtained in any form), provided by any other public or private body, for the same course year (see [10.1](#));
- transfer from another Italian or foreign university or change degree programme and re-enrol in the same year of study in which they had already been enrolled;
- enroll in the first, second or third year of studies in a single-cycle master's degree programme after having already obtained a Bachelor's degree in any Italian or foreign university;
- enroll as repeat students;
- are enrolled in a year of study (of the same course level) for which they had already been enrolled in any Italian or foreign university, regardless of the time elapsed since the previous enrollment and regardless of how the previous academic career ended (**including cases of withdrawal from studies or forfeiture**);
- have outstanding debts towards the University or have failed to comply with an agreed instalment payment plan.

Students with a four-year/five-year degree obtained prior to the reform introduced by D.M. 509/99 are considered to hold a master's degree.

Even when enrolled in two or more academic careers simultaneously in the same academic year, students may obtain the scholarship for only one programme and only for years of study for which they have never previously received the same benefit. In the case of multiple careers started in the same academic year, the student must choose which of the two academic careers will be associated with the right-to-education benefits for the entire period of simultaneous enrollment in the two degree programmes, without any possibility of changing it from one academic year to the next, unless the selected academic career is closed. If the different simultaneous careers have been started in two different academic years, the student must use the career started first as the reference for the purposes of the right-to-education benefits.


Students withdrawing from studies or subject to forfeiture: students who enroll following a withdrawal from studies or forfeiture at this or another university may apply for the scholarship only for years of study in which they have never previously been enrolled in any previous academic careers. In case of partial recognition of the previous academic career closed due to withdrawal or forfeiture, see the next point 3.1.2 for information on how the credits (CFU) are counted.

3.1.2. Academic regularity

Except for the grounds for exclusion set out at point 3.1.1, in order to be eligible for the scholarship, students must meet the academic regularity requirement with reference to the first absolute enrollment, unless one of the exceptions set out below applies.

“First absolute enrollment” means the first academic year of enrollment in any course (*including a different degree programme from the one attended in the academic year 2026/2027*) with the same type and level of admission qualification required for the programme in which the student is enrolled for the a.y. 2026/2027, in any Italian or foreign university, regardless of the outcome of that academic career and regardless of the time elapsed since that event.

 **Example:** If the student had enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme in Economics in 2020/2021 and later changed programme and enrolled in a single-cycle master's degree in Law in 2023/2024, the first absolute enrollment is a.y. 2020/2021.

In the scholarship application, the student must declare any previous academic careers undertaken using the same type and level of admission qualification, together with the outcome of such careers (*withdrawal from studies, degree programme change, transfer from another university, award of a degree, etc.*).

Consequently:

- for students enrolled in a Bachelor's degree, master's degree and single-cycle master's degree, **the number of credits necessary to be included in the scholarship rankings is calculated with reference to the credits required for each academic year elapsed, starting from the year of first absolute enrollment, with the exception of the years of suspension or interruption of studies and the years in which the student is not enrolled (see the “Exception” note below).**
- students enrolled in Ph.D programs or Specialisation Schools must not have experienced any interruption in the regular progression of their years of study (*transfers involving repetition of the same year of study, enrollments as a repeat student or outside prescribed time*) for the study level for which the scholarship is sought, in any Italian or foreign university.

Degree programme change or transfer: in the event of transfer from another university or change of degree programme, all years of enrollment in the previous programme are taken into account for the purposes of first absolute enrollment. Any achieved credits are counted towards the merit requirement only if they are recognized and registered in the libretto (academic record) of the new degree programme. If a year of study is repeated, the student is not entitled to the scholarship for that year.

Exception for students withdrawing from studies or subject to forfeiture: notwithstanding the above, in case of withdrawal from studies or forfeiture during the previous academic career in this or in another university, the first academic year of enrollment in the new academic career will be considered as “first absolute enrollment” **only if the student has never previously been enrolled in the same year of study for which the scholarship is sought**. In this case only credits earned after the date of enrollment in the new academic career will be counted, without taking into account any credits recognized from the previous career. The student cannot obtain the scholarship for the years of study they are repeating after the withdrawal from studies or forfeiture.

⚠ Therefore, if the student enrolls in Bicocca after having studied in another university, withdrawal from studies and transfer procedures have different consequences on academic regularity. The student is required to check with the previous university which specific procedure was followed.

Examples

Exception for students with a Bachelor’s degree: if the student has obtained a Bachelor’s degree and subsequently started a new academic career in a single-cycle master’s degree programme from its first year, the first year of the new academic career will be considered the first absolute enrollment for scholarship purposes **from the fourth year onwards**, without taking into account the previous Bachelor’s degree career completed with the award of the degree. In this case only the CFU credits achieved after the new enrollment in the single-cycle master’s degree programme will be counted towards the merit requirement. This exception does not apply in case of enrollment to a single-cycle master’s degree programme with career shortening (see below).

Career shortening: in the event of enrollment in a degree programme with career shortening (even in case of previous withdrawal from studies or enrollment in a single-cycle degree after obtaining a Bachelor’s degree), the years of study in the previous academic career are counted for the purposes of first absolute enrollment. Any achieved credits are counted towards the merit requirement only if they are recognized for the purposes of the new degree programme. The students cannot obtain the scholarship for years of study they are repeating.

Exception for pre-university education abroad: notwithstanding the above-mentioned academic regularity requirements, an exception applies to students who obtained a secondary school diploma abroad after a school cycle lasting less than 12 years and who are enrolled in the first year of a Bachelor’s degree programme or a single-cycle master’s degree programme. These students, before enrolling in a European Union university, must make up the difference between the duration of their school education and the required 12 years by attending university in their home country for the necessary number of years. These years of university enrollment, if equal to the number of years missing to reach 12, are NOT counted for the purposes of the academic regularity requirement.

Examples

3.2. Students enrolled in the FIRST year of all degree programmes

For students enrolled in the first year of any degree programme, eligibility for the scholarship depends on meeting two requirements:

Access requirement → necessary to obtain the benefit.

Ex-post merit requirement → necessary to maintain it, without having to repay the scholarship amount (to be met after the scholarship has been granted)

3.2.1. Access requirement

Students enrolled in the first year of **Bachelor’s degree programmes and single-cycle master’s degree programmes** must have obtained a high school diploma (or an equivalent qualification required for admission to the university system) with a final mark of **at least 70/100 (66/100 for students with a disability of 66% or more, or pursuant to art. 3, paragraph 1 or 3, of the law n. 104)**. Students who have obtained a high school diploma in a foreign country will be assessed on the basis of the final mark indicated in the documentation relating to the foreign qualification, according to the diploma mark resulting from the application of the conversion formula adopted by the MIUR (MIUR note of 4 June 2007):

$$V_{eq} = \frac{(V - V_{min})}{(V_{max} - V_{min})} * 40 + 60$$

There is no final mark requirement for students enrolled in the first year of **master’s degree programmes**.

3.2.2. Ex-post merit requirement (only for first year students)

For students enrolled in the first year of any degree programme, the beneficiary status is determined in the final rankings on the basis of the economic requirements mentioned at [point 4](#).

To remain a full beneficiary, the student must achieve a minimum number of credits (CFU) **by August 10 2027**, as indicated in the [TABLE OF MERIT](#) that will be published on the University website on the following page:

The above-mentioned [TABLE OF MERIT](#) indicates the exact merit requirements for each year of each degree programme. If the maximum number of credits that can be earned annually under the degree programme regulations is 60 or more, the requirement is the same as the standard requirement in the table below. However, if the maximum number of credits that can be earned annually is less than 60, a proportional criterion (rounded down) is applied to determine the merit requirement. For every annual course (“corsi a carattere annuale”), the standard ex-post merit requirement in the table below is reduced by 2 credits.

Examples

If the student has not met the above requirement by 10 August 2027, **to remain a partial beneficiary**, they must achieve the minimum number of credits by November 30 2027.

Students who do not achieve the minimum number of credits by November 30 2027 will forfeit the scholarship benefit and will have to repay the amount received (see point [11.1](#)).

3.3. Students enrolled in the SECOND AND SUBSEQUENT years of all degree programmes

Students enrolled in the second and subsequent years of any degree programme must have achieved, in their current academic career, the number of credits specified in the [TABLE OF MERIT](#) that will be published on the University website on the following page, resulting from **exams completed, registered and included in the student's study plan by August 10 2026** (*not ex-post*):

(NB: read points [3.5](#) and [3.6](#) carefully)

The above-mentioned [TABLE OF MERIT](#) indicates the exact merit requirements for each year of each degree programme. If the maximum number of credits that can be earned annually under the degree programme regulations is 60 or more, the requirement is the same as the standard requirement in the table below. However, if the maximum number of credits that can be earned annually is less than 60, a proportional criterion (rounded down) is applied to determine the merit requirement. For every annual course (“corsi a carattere annuale”), the standard ex-post merit requirement in the table below is reduced by 2 credits.

NB: The maximum credits required for students enrolled in the first year outside the prescribed time are always reduced by the number of credits assigned to the final examination (thesis).

Examples

Important: To determine the year of study relevant for the merit requirement, students must take into account not only the year of study in their current academic career, but **all years of enrolment in the university system** starting from **the first absolute enrolment**, including the academic years in which the student repeated, for any reason, the same year of studies (see [3.1.2](#)).

Example: a **second-year** student who has previously been enrolled twice in the **first year** will be considered for the scholarship as a **third-year** student. This student will be required to meet the merit requirements for the **third year**.

3.4. Part-time enrollment

For students with part-time enrollment, the minimum CFU credit requirement is reduced in proportion to the reduction in the maximum number of annual credits compared with the corresponding full-time degree programme, with any resulting fraction rounded down.

Consequently, the scholarship amount is halved compared with the amount granted to students enrolled in the full-time degree programmes, all other conditions being equal (income bracket and geographical origin).

3.5. Validity of CFU credits and weighted average

3.5.1. Valid Credits

The following table summarises the valid credits for the merit requirements set out in points [3.2.2](#) and [3.3](#). These credits must be achieved before the above-mentioned deadlines.

For master's degree programmes, CFUs achieved during the Bachelor's degree, including credits in excess of 180, even if recognised at enrollment in the master's degree programme.
Ex-post merit for the first year: alternatively, credits recognised for the degree programme in which the student enrolls in a.y. 2027/2028, albeit different from the previous one, will be considered valid, provided that the programme is within the same university.	

3.5.2. Weighted Average

For second and subsequent years the student must calculate and declare the weighted average based on the valid exams. Examinations with marks not expressed in thirtieths should not be considered. The grade "30 with honours" is counted as 30.

3.6. Bonus

The bonus is a provision that grants the student a limited number of additional CFU credits, **valid only for the purpose of meeting the scholarship merit requirement**, if they have not achieved the minimum number of credits.

Please note: bonus credits are not registered in the libretto (academic record) and are not valid for the purpose of obtaining a degree.

How many bonus credits can be used

The maximum number of available bonus credits depends on the year of study in which they are used for the first time:

- **up to five credits**, if used for the first time to maintain the first-year scholarship and/or to obtain the scholarship for the second year;
- **up to twelve credits**, if used for the first time to obtain the scholarship for the third year;
- **up to fifteen credits**, if used for the first time to obtain the scholarship for the years of study beyond the third.

How to use the bonus.

- After being used for the first time, the bonus cannot be increased in the subsequent years.
- If the student does not use all the available bonus credits, they can use only the remaining bonus in the subsequent years.

Example: If the student uses 8 bonus credits out of a maximum of 12 in the third year, in subsequent years they can use the remaining bonus of 4 credits.

- The remaining bonus must be calculated in the above-mentioned manner even if the bonus has been used for the first time in a different academic career or at a different university. **The bonus previously used at other universities reduces the remaining bonus available at Bicocca.**

Bonus during master's degree

- For the **master's degree programmes** (not single-cycle) it is not possible to use the bonus to meet the ex-post merit requirement for the first year.
- The student can use only the remaining bonus from Bachelor's degree for second and subsequent years of master's degree programmes.
- The bonus is not available, since it has never been accrued, to students enrolled in a master's degree programme who have obtained a first level degree in a foreign university or in degree programmes prior to the D.M. 509/99 and 270/04.

Proportional criterion

The bonus is recalculated in proportion to the maximum number of credits that can be achieved in the year in which it is used.

How to request the bonus

The bonus must be requested through [Sportello online](#) during the completion of the scholarship application.

To meet the ex-post merit requirement for the first year of Bachelor's degree or single-cycle master's degree, students can request the bonus by emailing dsu@unimib.it

The bonus is not applied unless requested by the student and is valid only for the relevant year of study.

3.7. Students with disabilities

Students with a disability of 66% or more (or pursuant to article 3, paragraph 1 or 3, of the law n. 104 of 5 February 1992) may have individual merit requirements based on the type of disability and differing from the values set out in points [3.2.2](#) and [3.3](#) by up to 40%. The merit requirements will be established by a dedicated Commission.

3.8. Specialisation Schools and Ph.D programmes

The scholarship beneficiaries enrolled in the **first year** of Ph.D programmes or Specialisation Schools are entitled to the benefit if they meet all the admission requirements for the course. There is no ex-post merit requirement to maintain the scholarship.

Students enrolled in the **second and subsequent years** of Ph.D programmes or Specialisation Schools must be regularly enrolled in the declared course year and maintain academic regularity (see [3.1.2](#)).

4. ECONOMIC REQUIREMENTS

To meet the economic requirement necessary for the scholarship application, students must have a valid ISEE 2026 **with values not exceeding the following limits:**

ISEE	€ 26.887,93
ISPE*	€ 58.452,06

* ISPE = ISP/ equivalence scale

The two limits must be met simultaneously. Exceeding even one of them means that the student does not meet the economic requirement and is therefore not eligible for the benefit.

Students who, having attended the filter semester at a different university, decide to enroll at Milan-Bicocca in the second semester will have to be in possession of an ISEE 2026 for university purposes, which must be requested by December 31 2026.

Read the "[ISEE Guide](#)" carefully.

5. SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT

The scholarship amount is differentiated according to the ISEE of the student's household and according to their geographical origin.

5.1. Income brackets

5.2. Geographical origin

Students are divided into three groups according to the travel time between the household residence and the location of their courses.

If the household members have more than one residence, the travel time will be calculated using the residence closest to the course location. **If the student changes their residence and moves closer to the course location, the travel time will be calculated considering the student's residence (with the exception of foreign students with the household resident abroad, in possession of a study visa, as well as political refugees).**

How to calculate the travel time: The duration of the route that must be considered is the minimum one, based on the journey by public transport, excluding the initial and final journeys on foot or by individual transport; when more than one means of transport is used, the intermediate times are also counted. High-speed trains shall not be considered.

Travel times are based on the timetables of Trenitalia and local transport companies and can be verified by consulting:

False declarations may result in penalties (see “Checks on the accuracy of self-declarations” at point [2.1](#)).

- a. **“In sede” students:** students residing in the same town as the degree programme (or in the surrounding areas), pursuant to art. 4 comma 8 of DPCM 9 April 2001, whose daily travel time by public transport from their residence to the course location does not exceed 60 minutes.
- b. **“Pendolari” (commuter) students:** students residing in towns from which it is possible to reach the course location by public transport with a travel time between 60 and 90 minutes.
- c. **“Fuori sede” students:** students residing in towns from which it is possible to reach the course location by public transport with a travel time of more than 90 minutes. For this reason they take up paid accommodation near the location of the degree programme.
Months of paid accommodation required for “fuori sede” in a.y. 2026/2027: at least 10 full months between September 2026 and September 2027. If September 2026 has already been used to qualify for “fuori sede” status in a.y. 2025/2026, only the period from October 2026 to September 2027 will be considered. For students enrolled in the first year outside prescribed time, it is sufficient to have a paid accommodation for at least 5 months by March 2027.*
- d. **Independent students:** students who meet **all** the requirements for independent students specified in the [“ISEE Guide”](#) on the University website, regardless of geographical origin, and take up paid accommodation under the same conditions indicated for “fuori sede” students.

The lease contract must be registered with the Italian Revenue Agency (Agenzia delle Entrate) and be in the name of the student or a member of the student's household. The paid accommodation must be located at least 30 minutes away from the household residence and reduce the travel time to the course location by at least 30 minutes compared with travelling from the household residence.

The rent must be in line with current local market prices.

If the required documents are not uploaded, the student will be considered “pendolare” (commuter).

The “fuori sede” status is recognized to students who graduate before having completed the minimum months indicated above, in the presence of a valid lease contract.

If the student loses the “fuori sede” status, the scholarship amount will consequently be recalculated for the entire academic year.

**To further promote women's access to higher education in scientific subjects and reduce the so-called "gender gap" in these fields, the scholarship amount for female students enrolled in S.T.E.M. degree programmes (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) is increased by 20%.*

5.3.2. Students enrolled in the first year outside prescribed time and part-time students

All the amounts indicated in point 5.3.1 are halved for students who are entitled to the scholarship for one additional semester beyond the regular duration of the degree programme, calculated with reference to the year of first absolute enrollment.

The amounts are also halved for students enrolled on a part-time basis.

5.3.3. Graduation Award Supplement to the DSU Scholarship

Students who are beneficiaries of the scholarship for their last course year in the a.y. 2026/2027 are entitled to a Graduation Award Supplement, equal to half of the amount of the scholarship received (excluding the deduction for the free canteen service), if they obtain their degree (Bachelor's degree, master's degree and single-cycle master's degree) **within the prescribed time** by the last graduation session of a.y. 2026/2027 (March 2028, or April 2028 for medical degree programmes).

Subject to funding by Regione Lombardia, the Graduation Award Supplement will be automatically granted to eligible students, without the need to submit any application.

The Graduation Award Supplement is incompatible with the partial scholarship granted for one additional semester beyond the regular duration of the degree programme: students enrolled in the first year outside the prescribed time in a.y. 2027/2028, who receive this partial scholarship and subsequently obtain their degree by the last graduation session of academic year 2026/2027, **will receive only the difference between the graduation award and the scholarship, only if the amount of the graduation award that would otherwise be payable is higher.**

There is no minimum degree mark required to be eligible for the Graduation Award Supplement.

The Graduation Award Supplement will be paid after the last graduation session of a.y. 2026/2027 and by the end of July 2028.

5.4. Free canteen service

Free canteen service is available to scholarship beneficiaries enrolled in any year and to eligible non-beneficiaries enrolled in second and subsequent years.

Eligible non-beneficiary students enrolled in the first year of study can access the canteen service at the first-bracket tariff.

Students who do not use the canteen service are not entitled to any reimbursement, except for documented periods of study away from the location of the degree programme in case of Erasmus (in Italy or abroad) or other educational activities on the initiative of the University and included in the degree programme (internship, etc): if these students have already submitted or intend to submit the application for international mobility integration by April 30 2027, they do not have to request the canteen reimbursement, since it will be included in the above-mentioned integration (see point [6.2](#) and the [example of the integration calculation](#)).

If there are no affiliated restaurants or canteens near the location of the student's degree programme, the student can contact servizi.dsu@unimib.it in order to arrange how the canteen service will be provided.

When the student obtains their degree, they lose the right to use the canteen service, unless they continue, without interruption, at the higher level of study:

- the student enrolled in the last regular year of any level of study is entitled to the free canteen service until December 31 following graduation only if they continue, without interruption, at the higher level of study at the University of Milano-Bicocca;
- the student enrolled in the first year outside the prescribed time of any level of study is entitled to the free canteen service until June 30 following graduation only if they continue, without interruption, at the higher level of study at the University of Milano-Bicocca.

Before January 1 2027 the cost of the meal will depend on the income bracket based on the ISEE value.

6. SCHOLARSHIP INTEGRATIONS

6.1. Students with disabilities

6.1.1. Amounts

If the scholarship beneficiary belongs to the categories mentioned in art. 2 of the law March 19, 1971, n.118 or to other categories of disabled people protected by law, with a recognised disability of 66% or more (or pursuant to article 3, paragraph 1 or 3, of the law n. 104 of 5 February 1992), the annual amount of the scholarship can be increased by maximum of 40%.

This scholarship can be attributed upon a justified request from the student and can be converted into specialist equipment, separated learning material, place in housing facilities, assignment of a helper or assistant for studies, interpreter or any other appropriate means of overcoming particular individual difficulties.

6.1.2. Period and methods of payment

The scholarship increases for students with disabilities will be assigned by a special commission after the publication of the final scholarship rankings and paid to entitled students, in accordance with the methods set out in point [9.1](#), with the first installment of the scholarship.

6.2. International mobility

6.2.1. Amounts for international mobility

Students who receive scholarships, except for students enrolled in a Specialisation Schools, can compete for the assignment of integration for international mobility. This integration can be also requested by the students who take part in an Italian Erasmus.

The assignment of the scholarship integration is based on the available funds and on the duration of the period spent abroad.

The integration amounts to € 600,00 a month for the duration of the period spent abroad, up to a maximum of ten months. The study programme or internship carried out abroad must be certified by the structures responsible for international exchange at the University. The amount of any other contributions granted with European Union funds, as a result of bilateral agreements even outside the EU, and with funds made available by public or private entities is deducted from the amount of the scholarship integration.

The students are also entitled to reimbursement for:

- round-trip travel expenses up to € 100,00 for European countries and up to € 500,00 for non-European countries;
- the amount of the deduction for free meals not used during the period of residence abroad, except for August;
- for the beneficiaries of the housing service at preferential tariff, the amount withheld from the scholarship for the payment of the housing service during the months of residence abroad (see [6.2](#))

The reimbursement of meals and housing service fees will be calculated on the basis of the number of months spent far from the degree programme location and will be paid only for study or internship travels within the Erasmus programme (in Italy or abroad). Other periods of study on the initiative of the student will not be reimbursed.

These rights are extended, upon a request from the student, to the graduates involved in mobility projects of the European Leonardo programme (or similar initiatives) provided that they graduated no more than one year before the start of the traineeship and that they were eligible for the Scholarship in the last year of studies.

The integration for international mobility is granted to the entitled students only once for each course level.

6.2.2. International mobility rankings and payment

The provisional rankings of the integration for international mobility will be published on "[Sportello online](#)" by January 31 2028. Any motivated appeals against the outcome of the rankings must be presented within 15 days after the publication. Once the appeals have been evaluated, the final rankings will be published.

The assignment of the integrations will be based on the criteria adopted for the scholarship rankings, up to the amount of the planned budget.

The payment of the integration (including reimbursement of meals and travel expenses) will take place by March 31 2028 in accordance with the methods set out in point [9.1](#). (For possible accommodation refund see [6.2](#)).

6.3. Simultaneous enrollments

Students enrolled in two degree programmes at the same time in accordance with the law can obtain and maintain the scholarship, increased by 20%, for one of the degree programmes, if they possess and maintain the established merit requirements for the entire duration of both academic careers. The student is not eligible for the integration if they lose the merit requirements for the scholarship for one of the courses of study.

To obtain this integration, it is necessary to select the declaration of double enrollment on [Sportello online](#).

7. PREPARATION OF THE RANKINGS

Students with a recognised disability of 66% or more (or pursuant to article 3, paragraph 1 or 3, of the law n. 104 of 5 February 1992) and who are eligible for the scholarship are entitled to get the benefit even in excess of the number of available scholarships.

7.1. Students enrolled in the FIRST year of all DEGREE PROGRAMMES and ALL years of PH.D and Specialisation Schools

The ranking is based on the ISEE of the household compared to the limit of € 26.887,93 for a maximum of 1000 points assigned with the following formula:

$$Score = \left(1 - \frac{students' s ISEE}{26.887,93} \right) * 1.000$$

The ranking order is determined degressively on the basis of scoring. In case of equal scores, the grade of the previous educational qualification and then the minor age prevails.

For students who enroll in a.y. 2026/2027 in Milano-Bicocca for the filter semester of single-cycle master's degree programmes in "medicina e chirurgia" and "odontoiatria e protesi dentaria", pursuant to Ministerial Decrees n. 418 of 05-30-2025, n. 431 of 06-20-2025 and n. 447 of 11-07-2025, there will be a separate ranking, the "second semester scholarship ranking", calculated with the same formula. Students who, having attended the filter semester at a different university, decide to enroll at Milano-Bicocca in the second semester will subsequently be added to this ranking.

7.2. Students enrolled in SECOND AND SUBSEQUENT YEARS of all DEGREE PROGRAMMES

The ranking order is determined degressively on the basis of scoring. The total score derives from the sum of the score related to the number of credits achieved by August 10 2026 and the score determined by the weighted average of the completed exams (for the relevant credits). The total score is 1.000 points distributed as follows: 600 points based on the number of credits and 400 based on the weighted average.

In case of equal scores, the student who did not use the bonus and then the student with a higher score related to ISEE prevails in the rankings. In case of a further tie the younger student prevails.

The score based on the achieved credits, relating to exams completed and registered by August 10 2026, is calculated using the following formula:

(achieved credits – minimum credits)	X	600 (maximum credits – minimum credits)
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The score for the weighted average grade (for the relevant credits) of the exams completed and registered by August 10 2026 is calculated according to the following formula (the grade 30 with honors is counted as 30):

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8. PUBLICATION OF PROVISIONAL RANKINGS AND APPEALS

8.1. General ranking

The provisional rankings will be published By October 31 2026 on "[Sportello online](#)".

Any requests to review the position in the provisional rankings must be submitted online within and not later than 15 days after the publication of the provisional rankings.

Once the revision procedure is complete, the final ranking will be published.

Further appeals against the final decision must be presented to the Judicial Authorities within the deadline established by the current legislation.

Note for beneficiaries under condition: eligible students who are about to enroll in Ph. D programs, in Specialisation Schools or in the first year of the master's degree and single-cycle master's degree of Faculty of Medicine and Surgery, if not yet enrolled in the a.y. 2026/2027 (or if they have not obtained yet the qualification of the previous level) on the date of the publication of the final rankings, will be considered beneficiaries, but the benefit will be confirmed only if they complete the enrollment procedure in the a.y. 2026/2027. The same condition applies to non-UE students without a study visa: to confirm the benefit, these students have to obtain the study visa by January 30 2027.

8.2. Second semester ranking

The second semester provisional ranking, for students who enroll in the filter semester, will be published By October 31 2026 as the general ranking, with the deadline of 15 days to submit the requests of review.

Concurrently with the final general ranking, a further update (not yet definitive) of the second semester ranking will be published by November 30 2026, to take into account any appeals and changes of the ranking published in October. The publication date of the final ranking of the second semester will be communicated later with a specific announcement on the unimib.it website, as it will also take into account applications for DSU benefits from students enrolling in the second semester after having attended the filter semester at different universities.

9. PAYMENT OF THE SCHOLARSHIPS

9.1. Payment methods

The amounts due to the beneficiaries will be paid by crediting the University Card provided to each student. If the University Card is inactive, payment will be made to the alternative IBAN indicated by the student in the application, provided that it has been entered in [Sportello online](#) before the publication of the rankings.

With regard to beneficiaries of the housing service at preferential tariff (read the [housing service announcement](#)), € 1.536,00 will be withheld from the amount of the first installment of the scholarship in order to cover the first six months of residence in housing facilities and € 1.280,00 will be withheld from the amount of the balance to cover the remaining five months of residence. For students enrolled in the first year outside prescribed time only the first deduction applies.

The University reserves the right to make further deductions from the scholarship amounts in case of debit positions.

9.2. Payment times

9.2.1. First and second installment

The **first installment** of the scholarship, equal to 50% of the total amount (100% for students enrolled in the first year outside prescribed time), will be paid to the beneficiaries By December 31 2026.

Students who are beneficiaries under condition (who are about to enroll or obtain a study visa) will receive the first installment after completing the enrollment in the a.y. 2026/2027. There may be further payment delays, until they provide the documents required for "fuori sede" condition (see point [5.2](#)).

For students who enroll in the filter semester, the first installment can be paid only to beneficiaries of scholarship, after the confirmation of their studies at Milano-Bicocca in the second semester and the publication of the final ranking of the second semester. The exact payment schedule will be communicated in a subsequent announcement.

The **second installment**, with the remaining 50%, will be paid to the students enrolled in second and subsequent years by **June 30 2027** (consistent with the actual disbursement of funds).

For students enrolled in the first year, the second installment of the scholarship will be paid after the verification of the achievement of the minimum ex-post merit credits (see point [3.2.2](#)).

9.2.2. Graduation Award Supplement

The Graduation Award Supplement for obtaining the degree within the prescribed time in a.y. 2026/2027 will be paid to beneficiaries by July 31 2028, subject to funding by Lombardy Region.

10. INCOMPATIBILITY AND TRANSFERS

10.1. Incompatibility

The scholarship is **incompatible** and therefore not cumulative with:

- similar forms of economic aid provided by other public or private bodies;
- scholarships awarded by the University pursuant to art. 12 of the Prime Ministerial Decree of 9 April 2001;

- scholarships for foreign students provided by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs;

In such cases, the student has the right to choose one or the other benefit. The choice has to be made no later than 30 days after the assignment of the second benefit, sending a written communication to the University. Failing this, the student will incur the forfeiture of the benefits.

The scholarship is **compatible** with:

- contributions for residence abroad;
- scholarships for excellence courses provided by the University.

10.2. Transfers

The student who has moved from another University after the beginning of the academic year will have to ask the Managing Body of the Right to Education of the University of origin the official transmission of the application, submitted within the deadline indicated in the announcement of that University. The regularisation of the transfer must be completed before the publication of the final rankings. Admission to the rankings will be subject to the merit and the income requirements and to the availability of resources.

In case of transfer to another University after the beginning of the academic year, the student can ask the University, within 15 days after the publication of the provisional scholarship rankings, to send the submitted scholarship application to the University where the student is transferred.

In this case the student loses the scholarship granted by the University of Milano-Bicocca.

11. FORFEITURE OF THE SCHOLARSHIP BENEFITS

11.1. Total forfeiture

The student loses the scholarship benefit in the following cases:

- a. the student incurs disciplinary sanctions superior to the written censure for offenses committed against the University;
- b. the student does not submit to the University, within the deadline indicated by registered letter with acknowledgement of receipt, any original documentation required for checking the veracity of the produced self-certifications (see "[Checks of the self-certifications veracity](#)");
- c. the University verifies the non-truthfulness of the data declared by the student in self-certification and finds out that the student does not meet merit and/or the income requirement set out at points 3 and 4;
- d. the student submits an application to withdraw from the studies or transfers to another University during the a.y. 2026/2027. This provision does not apply in the case of students enrolled in the first year of Bachelor's degree, master's degree, single-cycle master's degree, if the merit requirement set out at point [3.2.2](#) is achieved by the student before the resignation or transfer;
- e. after the publication of the final rankings, the student is enrolled with repetitions of the year of studies in the a.y. 2026/2027;
- f. the student enrolled in the first year of Bachelor's degree, master's degree, single-cycle master's degree does not achieve the merit requirement set out at point [3.2.2](#);
- g. the student enrolled in the a.y. 2026/2027 has obtained the degree before the date of publication of the final rankings;
- h. the student being a beneficiary under condition (see [note at point 8](#)) does not enroll in the a.y. 2026/2027 within the established deadline;
- i. non-UE student who does not obtain the study visa by January 30 2027.

For students with a disability of 66% or more (or pursuant to article 3, paragraph 1 or 3, of the law n. 104) who do not meet the merit requirement set out in point [3.2.2](#) the provisions concerning the forfeiture of the scholarship and the payment of the second installment do not apply.

11.2. Partial forfeiture

The student enrolled in the first year of Bachelor's degree, master's degree, single-cycle master's degree loses the right to total scholarship benefit and obtains the right to partial scholarship benefit if they achieve the merit requirement set out at point [3.2.2](#) by November 30 2026.

11.3. Consequences of forfeiture

To learn more about the forfeiture resulting from an untruthful declaration see "[Checks of the self-certifications veracity](#)".

In other cases of forfeiture of the scholarship benefit that are not caused by false declarations, the student must pay to the University:

Agreements with the student can be concluded to define the recovery procedure, even by installments.

Failure to pay, in part or in full, the amount due will result in the opening of the procedures for the forced recovery, as well as the arrest of the academic career of the student until the payment is made.

EXCEPTIONAL SUBSIDY

(see [Deadline and procedure for submitting the application](#))

Exceptional Subsidies are assigned within the limits of the specific budgetary allocation and they can be accumulated with all the other forms of assistance. They can be granted only once during each academic year and, for the same event, only once for the entire duration of the university studies.

1. Amount

The amount of the Extraordinary Subsidy varies according to the seriousness of the situation and shall not exceed € 3.000,00.

* The Commission may increase the amount up to € 5000 if there are documented situations of particular gravity and exceptionality that have also led to the loss of the scholarship.

2. Cases when the Exceptional Subsidy can be granted:

- a. **A serious and sudden loss of family income**, resulting from job loss and the consequent unemployment of one or more members of the student's household, or from exceptional and unforeseen events that have caused a substantial reduction in the family's main source of income.
Required documentation: documents that prove the income loss (such as letter of dismissal, certificate of cessation of work activity, tax return with significant decrease compared to the previous year, certification of any lack of public subsidies...).
- A low ISEE value is not enough.**
It is advisable to request an updated ISEE declaration after the event.
- b. illnesses, accidents, surgical operations, expensive rehabilitative care, which have seriously affected the student or the members of the family jeopardizing the academic curriculum;
Required documentation: medical certificate attesting to the diagnosis and the need for treatment, medical records and hospital documentation, receipts for medical expenses, medical prescriptions for rehabilitation care or specialist treatments, documentation demonstrating an impact on the academic curriculum (such as requests for suspension or interruption of studies);
- c. death of a member of the student's family;
Required documentation: documents of the death and family status;
- d. students in a difficult economic situation that are facing periods of paternity/maternity (implementation of the Gender Equality Plan) ;
Required documentation: documentation of the birth or medical certification of ongoing pregnancy, documentation of the family status that indicates the composition of the family unit;
- e. psychotherapeutic support of the student.
Required documentation: letter from the specialist (psychologist, doctor, psychotherapist, etc.) certifying the therapy sessions, receipts for the therapy sessions.

The Commission, at its sole discretion, may also grant the exceptional subsidy in emergency situations that are not included in the list above.

The above-mentioned events must have occurred during the period May 1 2025 – April 30 2027.

3. Who can submit the application

Students who are regularly enrolled in the a.y. 2026/2027 in Bachelor's degree, master's degree, single-cycle master's degree, Specialisation Schools (with the exception of the medical schools referred to in Legislative Decree 368/99 and the TFA) and Ph.D programs (including beneficiaries of Ph.D scholarship and research grants) in the University of Milano Bicocca:

- up to the second year outside prescribed time for students enrolled in Bachelor's degree, master's degree and single cycle master's degree;
- up to the first year outside prescribed time for Ph.D programs and Specialisation Schools.

Students with a disability of 66% or more (or pursuant to article 3, paragraph 1 or 3, of the law n. 104) can apply for the exceptional subsidy for one additional year to the above-mentioned conditions.

All the students must meet the following economic requirements:

In exceptional and particularly serious cases, with appropriate motivation, the Commission, may decide to not consider the ISEE limits.

*To learn more about “Valid ISEE 2026” read the ISEE Guide.

In consideration of the possible change of the ISEE after the event for which the exceptional Subsidy is requested, it is also possible to accept the current ISEE and the ISEE 2027 with the DSU signed after the event and before the application deadline (in any case in time for the evaluation before the publication of the final ranking).

In any case the student will be excluded if they:

- are already in possession of a qualification of the same or higher level than the course for which they are requesting the benefit;
- are enrolled for the fourth time in the same course year, considering all the university careers of the same level.

4. When the application must be submitted

From July 7 2026 and by **April 30 2027**.

5. Documentation

Applicants must upload by April 30 2027 on “[Sportello online](#)” the documents that demonstrate the events for which the contribution is requested. The absence of such documentation will result in the automatic non-eligibility.

6. Provisional ranking

The provisional ranking will be published by May 31 2027 on “[Sportello online](#)”.

7. Appeals

Any requests to review the results must be submitted online within and not later than 15 days after the publication of the provisional rankings.

8. Final ranking

The final ranking will be published after the review procedure has been completed.

9. Payment

The amount due to the beneficiaries will be paid by July 31 2027.

10. Commission

Applications admitted for evaluation in the preliminary phase and any subsequent appeals will be examined by a special commission chosen by the Rector.

HOUSING SERVICE

(see [Deadline and procedure for submitting the application](#))

1. AVAILABLE ACCOMMODATION PLACES

1.1. General information

All University Residences are reserved for students regularly enrolled in the academic year 2026/2027 in Bachelor's degree programmes, master's degree programmes, single-cycle master's degree programmes, Ph.D programmes and Specialisation Schools (with the exception of medical Specialisation Schools referred to in Legislative Decree 368/99). Applicants must meet the merit and income requirements for the scholarship.

To apply for an accommodation place it is necessary to submit the application through "[Sportello online](#)" by **August 20 2026**.

Read the [University Residences regulations](#) carefully.

For information about the available residences, please check [UniMIB Residence Halls: A Student Guide](#).

1.2. Filter Semester

The above-mentioned application deadline and procedures are also valid for students who enroll in a.y. 2026/2027 in Milano-Bicocca for the filter semester of single-cycle master's degree programmes in "medicina e chirurgia" and "odontoiatria e protesi dentaria", pursuant to Ministerial Decrees n. 418 of 05-30-2025, n. 431 of 06-20-2025 and n. 447 of 11-07-2025. **Admission to the University Residences is scheduled only from October 1 2026**, due to the inability of the University to assign the accommodation places in September 2026 for the new admissions. A further notice will subsequently be published on the [unimib.it](#) website, with the reopening of the application period for students who, having attended the filter semester at a different university, decide to enroll at Milan-Bicocca in the second semester: these students will be able to benefit from the housing service only if they meet the income and merit requirements, **subject to the availability of remaining bed spaces**.

In case of further availability of accommodation places, in the second semester the University may open a second application window also for other students who meet the eligibility requirements and who have not submitted an accommodation application by the initial deadline.

2. CONFIRMATION OF THE ACCOMMODATION PLACE

Please note that any exams completed after submission of the application, and in any case by August 10 2026 must be communicated immediately to Student Services Office, in order to allow a timely and accurate evaluation of the merit requirement.

3. NEW ADMISSIONS

Who can be admitted	Students resident in a town from which it is possible to reach the course location in more than 90 minutes. For the calculation of the travel time, see the scholarship section at point 5.2 . Exceptions to the 90-minute requirement may be granted up to a maximum of n. 2 places, including confirmations , in duly documented exceptional and serious cases.
Who is excluded	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> students resident in towns where the university residences or apartments are located; students with outstanding debts to the University or the former CIDiS, or who have failed to comply with agreed instalment plans.

For non-EU students whose household resides more than 90 minutes from the course location, the assignment of accommodation places is carried out so as to promote a balanced distribution of accommodation beneficiaries, in accordance with the principles of inclusion, pluralism and intercultural exchange.

4. PREPARATION OF THE RANKINGS AND PUBLICATION OF THE RESULTS

4.1. Preparation of the rankings

The available accommodation places will be assigned in the following order:

1. Confirmations at the preferential tariff, until all confirmation requests have been satisfied;
2. New admissions at the preferential tariff for the following categories:
 - EU students enrolled in the first year (and all years of Ph.D and Specialisation Schools)
 - non-EU students enrolled in the first year (and all years of Ph.D and Specialisation Schools)
 - EU students enrolled in subsequent years of Bachelor's degree, master's degree, single cycle master's degree
 - non-EU students enrolled in subsequent years of Bachelor's degree, master's degree, single cycle master's degree

The rankings are based on income and merit requirements used for the allocation of scholarships (see [point 7](#) of the Scholarship section). For students whose household is entirely resident abroad, in case of a further tie after comparing age, for the purpose of the housing service only the household with the larger number of members will prevail.

The preferences indicated in the application will be taken into account, subject to the availability of free accommodation places and the University's organisational requirements.

In the preparation of the rankings the students with a disability of 66% or more (or pursuant to article 3, paragraph 1 or 3, of the law n. 104 of 5 February 1992) will be given priority.

For PhD students who meet the merit and income requirements but are also recipients of a Ministerial Scholarship, an initial maximum of 80 accommodation places is available, without prejudice to the possibility of assigning additional places if available after the rankings have been exhausted.

Students with outstanding debts to the University or the former CIDiS, or who have failed to comply with agreed instalment plans are automatically excluded from the rankings. This also applies to students in debt to ex-Consortio CIDiS. It is possible to remove the exclusion by paying the debt before the deadline for the submission of the appeals, otherwise the student will remain non-eligible in the final ranking and for the confirmations the student will be dismissed from the accommodation place ex officio.

4.2. Publication of the results and appeals

The provisional rankings will be published on "[Sportello online](#)" by **September 2 2026**.

Any reasoned and documented **appeals** must be submitted **within 7 days** after the publication of the rankings, by completing the dedicated form available on the outcome page of "[Sportello online](#)".

Once the revision procedure is completed, the University will publish the final rankings by **September 18 2026**. Further appeals against the definitive decision can be presented to the Judicial Authority in accordance with the current legislation.

5. ASSIGNMENT OF THE ACCOMMODATION PLACE

5.1. Accommodation period

New admissions	from October 1 2026 to 12.00 on September 28 2027 , except for August 2027.

August:

Students must leave their room empty during August to allow maintenance work to be carried out. They will be able to return to their rooms from September 1 2027.

The student who has been assigned an accommodation place must scrupulously comply with the [University Residences Regulation](#).

5.2. Assignment

The student who is a beneficiary in the final rankings at the time of accepting the accommodation place **must be up to date with the payment of the academic fees for a.y. 2026/2027**, otherwise they will lose the benefit.

The student who is not yet enrolled (i.e. who has not yet paid the academic fees for a.y. 2026/2027) may **suspend** the assignment only if they are:

- a) waiting to obtain the degree of the study level preceding the one for which they have applied for accommodation;
- b) waiting for further admissions from the ranking list for limited-access programmes or for enrollment in a Ph. D;
- c) waiting for the issue of a STUDY VISA;
- d) taking part in a period of study abroad (or in an Italian location that is far from the degree programme and the accommodation) within the programmes provided by the University (see point [6.2](#) of the scholarship section and [5.4](#) of the current section).

In the above-mentioned cases, at the time of suspension, the student must indicate in “[Sportello online](#)” the expected date of their arrival at the accommodation place and subsequently communicate the final arrival date to servizi.dsu@unimib.it, with at least 7 days’ notice. In the absence of such notice within the time limits, the Office reserves the right to set an assignment date after the one indicated by the student. If the previously indicated arrival date passes without any communication from the student, the stay will be canceled and the accommodation place will be assigned to the next eligible student in the ranking.

- In cases at points **a)** and **b)**, the accommodation place will be assigned to the student and maintained until October 31 2026. After that date, the assignment may take place only after the student definitively communicates their arrival date and only if accommodation places are still available.

- In case at point **c)**, the accommodation place will be assigned to the student and maintained until November 30 2026. After that date, the assignment may take place only after the student definitively communicates their arrival date and only if accommodation places are still available.

- In case at point **d)**, the accommodation place will be assigned to the student and maintained until the date of return indicated by the student.

5.2.1. Assignment for confirmations

At the end of the procedure the student will receive a confirmation of acceptance at their *campus* email address. The student must print the admission letter available in “[Sportello online](#)” and present it to the reception of the residence.

Students who do not complete the acceptance will lose the benefit and must leave the room on September 28 2026.

Erasmus students who intend to return to the accommodation at the end of the mobility programme must still complete the acceptance by the above-mentioned deadline.

Students who do not check in at the reception after the acceptance procedure and within 15 days from the scheduled arrival date will lose the accommodation place.

5.2.2. Convocation and assignment for new admissions - BENEFICIARIES

The assignment occurs following the order of four rankings: EU students enrolled in second and subsequent years, non-EU students enrolled in second and subsequent years, EU students enrolled in the first year and non-EU students enrolled in the first year.

Within the limits of the availability of free beds, the preferences expressed in the on-line application will be taken into account.

In order to complete the assignment procedures, the student will have to carry out the following procedure:

- e) select acceptance - renunciation - suspension;
- f) in case of acceptance, self-certify the university enrollment and indicate the matriculation number.

Once the procedure has been completed, the student who accepts the bed will receive the confirmation of acceptance at his campus email address. The admission letter is available on “[Sportello online](#)”.

The letter must be presented to the Residence of destination, together with a valid identity document.

Students who do not check in at the reception after the acceptance procedure and within 15 days from the scheduled arrival date will lose the accommodation place.

The student assigned to courses located in Sondrio, who intends to obtain a bed in the facility U182 of Sondrio, together with the acceptance procedure must contact servizi.dsu@unimib.it to indicate the chosen destination.

The student who intends to suspend the acceptance must indicate that option and comply with the provisions of section [5.2](#).

5.2.3. Convocation and assignment for new admissions – ELIGIBLE NON-BENEFICIARIES

When beneficiary students give up the accommodation place, the residences made available will be reassigned to other eligible students according to the order in the ranking and according to the assignment modalities for the beneficiaries. Acceptances will be available in the time and in the ways that will be communicated.

After the acceptance, the student must follow the instructions at point [5.2.2](#).

5.3. International Mobility

Students who are beneficiary of an accommodation place and who participate in an international mobility programme in the academic year 2026/2027 must communicate to servizi.dsu@unimib.it both the departure and the return date. During the period of absence the bed may be assigned to another student; upon returning from the program, a bed will be guaranteed to the student, but it will NOT necessarily be the same bed and the same Residence.

Entitled students can resume possession of the bed only on the expiry date of the mobility project, without prejudice to any availability of beds in case of early exit from the mobility program.

6. TARIFFS AND DEADLINES

6.1. General information

The tariff amount is halved if the student stays in the facility for no longer than 15 days in each month (14 for the month of February) and the payment refers to the period of actual use.

If a student with disability needs an accompanying person, they will have to pay the related cost.

Students who fail to pay the installment within the deadlines mentioned below must pay a penalty of € 15,00. The delay of more than 30 days from the deadline will cause the automatic loss of the right of the accommodation place, the forced recovery of the amount and the arrest of the academic career until the payment.

6.1.1. Extension for degree completion

Students enrolled in the **first year outside prescribed time** of the degree programmes may continue to benefit from the preferential tariff until March 31 2027 or until the month in which they obtain their degree, whichever comes first. For the following months, it will be possible to request an extension of the stay only until the month in which the degree is awarded and, in any case, no later than July 31 2027. The extension request must be submitted through "[Sportello online](#)" from 1 to 28 February 2027 and will be granted only in case of availability of places at non-preferential tariff of € 350,00 per month. The extension request will be considered valid only upon **advance** payment of the tariff for the additional period of stay. At the time of the request, the student must also indicate the number of months for which they intend to remain, which cannot be changed afterwards. The advance payment may be made either in a single payment or in two installments, depending on the length of the extension:

- Up to 2 months (ending no later than May 31 2027): payment for the entire period in a single installment by March 31 2027.
- More than 2 months (beyond May 31 2027 and ending no later than July 31 2027): payment for the first 2 months by March 31 2027 and for the remaining period by May 31 2027.

For students with a disability of 66% or more (or pursuant to article 3, paragraph 1 or 3, of the law n. 104) the period of stay may be further extended until February 28 2028, including after the award of the degree. After completing the ordinary extension according to the above-mentioned procedure, these students may contact servizi.dsu@unimib.it to request a further extension of their stay.

Only students who are about to graduate in April 2027 can request an extension of the accommodation at the preferential tariff until graduation, emailing servizi.dsu@unimib.it by February 28 2027.

PhD students who are about to obtain their degree (39th cycle and 38th ECOSTATDATA cycle) and who wish to use the accommodation for one additional academic year beyond the regular duration of their programme may apply for an extension through "[Sportello online](#)" by the same deadline as the ordinary accommodation applications (August 20 2026).

The payments must be made using "avviso di pagamento (PagoPA)", available in the section "Pagamenti con PagoPA" on "[Sportello online](#)". Following the verification of the accuracy of the declared information, the student may be assigned a different tariff during the academic year, with retroactive effect to the entire period of stay.

*For students beneficiary of the scholarship the amount of the housing service at preferential tariff will be directly deducted from the payment of the two installments of the scholarship, at the amount of € 1.536,00 and € 1.280,00 respectively. No payment notice will be issued. Any non-occupation periods during the year (as *Erasmus travels*) will be settled at the end of the academic year. If the student communicates to dsu@unimib.it and servizi.dsu@unimib.it the non-occupation periods in time, the deduction can be made only for the months of the actual occupation.

Students who are beneficiary of a scholarship under condition (see [note at point 8](#) in the scholarship section), in cases where they do not receive the first scholarship installment by December 31, may suspend the payment for the accommodation place until they complete the enrollment procedure in a.y. 2026/2027.

Students who will not be scholarship beneficiaries due to the absence of enrollment will have to pay the due amount (equal to the months of actual use during the academic year) at € 350,00 tariff, with payment conditions to be agreed writing to servizi.dsu@unimib.it, and must leave the university residence by a date to be agreed with servizi.dsu@unimib.it.

Students who enroll in the filter semester of Milano-Bicocca will have to pay for the accommodation on a monthly basis using "avviso di pagamento (PagoPA)", until the confirmation of their studies at Milano-Bicocca in the second semester and the publication of the final scholarship ranking of the second semester. If they will be beneficiaries of scholarship, the cost of the unpaid months spent in accommodation may be deducted from the scholarship payments.

6.3. Tariff reduction

The applied tariff will be proportionally reduced, in consideration of the reduction of the hospitality period, for the following students:

- students who are admitted after the beginning of the academic year;
- students who participate in an International Mobility Program, as long as it's certified by the University;
- students who are assigned to another university for a part of the academic year, in consideration of the particular educational system.

7. WITHDRAWAL - LOSS OF THE ACCOMMODATION PLACE

7.1. End of hospitality

If the student permanently leaves the accommodation for any reason, they must make an agreement with the Director/manager of the housing facility on the date of resignation.

Students enrolled in the first year of the course, after the withdrawal must contact dsu@unimib.it in order to verify their administrative status.

The student who is beneficiary of scholarship and who does not remain at the University housing facilities for at least 10 months (or 5 months in case of partial scholarship due to enrollment in a course year outside prescribed time) loses the "fuori sede" status, unless they provide documents of another paid living arrangement with the requirements at point [5.2](#) of the scholarship announcement.

7.2. Forfeiture

Students may lose the right to the accommodation place even if they result beneficiaries in the final rankings:

- for Reconfirmations: they did not follow the procedures set out at point [5.2.1](#);

- b. for Reconfirmations: they do not enroll in a.y. 2026/2027 by the established deadline;
- c. for New Admissions: they did not follow the procedures set out at points [5.2.2](#) or [5.2.3](#);
- d. for New Admissions: they are not regularly enrolled in the a.y. 2026/2027 at the moment of the accommodation place acceptance;
- e. for New Admission: they have not obtained a study visa by January 30 2027;
- f. for New Admissions: after attending the filter semester in Milano-Bicocca, they have not continued the second semester in the same university;
- g. they have made untrue statements. The provisions of the Announcement for the Assignment of the Scholarship are applied;
- h. they incur serious disciplinary sanctions.

CANTEEN SERVICE

(see [Deadline and procedure for submitting the application](#))

For a.y. 2026/2027, to access the canteen service with a **preferential tariff** at the University canteens and affiliated restaurants, students must submit a canteen service application using "[Sportello online](#)" by **April 30 2027**.

The canteen service for the a.y. 2026/2027 starts on October 1 and expires on December 31 2027. It is governed by the Regulations published on the University website: [Canteen service Regulation](#).

The canteen service allows the student to use:

- n. 1 daily meal at lunch time (*excluding public holidays*) for **"in sede"** and **"pendolari"** students (*see the definitions at point 5.2 of the scholarship announcement*);
- n. 2 daily meals for **"fuori sede"** students with the only distance requirement and **independent** students (*for the canteen service the lease contract is NOT required, see the definitions at point 5.2 of the scholarship announcement*).

In any case, the canteen service is suspended for all categories of students in the month of August and on the closing days of the canteens and affiliated restaurants.

The use of the canteen service is strictly personal.

1. WHO CAN BENEFIT FROM THE CANTEEN SERVICE

The canteen service is available to all the students enrolled in the a.y. 2026/2027 in Bachelor's degree, master's degree, single cycle master's degree, Specialisation Schools (with the exception of the medical Specialisation School referred to in Legislative Decree 368/99 and the TFA) and Ph.D programs activated by the University of Milano-Bicocca.

2. REQUIREMENTS

Students must meet the income and merit requirements specified below:

* including students with repetitions of the first year or repetitions of the first year after a transfer from another university or a change of degree programme. These students will have the right to the service based on their income bracket for a number of years equal to the prescribed duration of the course plus one (*starting from the first year of enrollment of the active academic career*).

** If the canteen request is submitted after December 31 2026, ISEE 2026 is still required.

NB: Students enrolled in more than one year outside prescribed time during the same academic career cannot benefit from the canteen service with preferential tariff.

3. AUTOMATIC EXCLUSION FROM THE CANTEEN SERVICE

Even if the student meets the economic and merit requirements, they will not have the right to the canteen service benefit in the following situations:

- previous award of another degree, diploma, specialty or other qualification as per Presidential Decree 162/1982 of a study level equal or superior to the programme attended in a.y. 2026/2027;
- second year of repetition of the same year of the study within the same academic career in a.y. 2026/2027;

- c. enrollment in the same year of the study for the third time during all the academic careers of the same level;
- d. existence of not agreed debts with the University or with ex-CIDIS;
- e. for Ph.D programs and Specialisation Schools: repetition of the same year of the study within the same academic career.

4. PRICE OF THE MEAL

These are the tariffs for the meal:

* The student can benefit from the reduced meal only at the canteens and affiliated restaurants that have an agreement about that and only for the evening and holiday meals. The University reserves the right to extend the possibility of using the reduced meal at other canteens, affiliated restaurants and meals by giving appropriate notice to the parties concerned.

5. TRANSFERS

Students who have applied for a transfer from another University to the University of Milano-Bicocca will obtain the right to use the canteen service after completing the enrollment.

6. FORFEITURE

Students who obtain the degree and do not continue at the higher level of study at the University of Milano-Bicocca lose the benefit of the canteen service. Any meals consumed after the graduation date will be charged at the full cost of the service. The sanction envisaged by the [Canteen service Regulation](#) will also be applied.

Students who obtain the degree and continue without interruption at the higher level of study at the University of Milano-Bicocca, can benefit from the canteen service at the current conditions up to December 31 2027. If the student does not continue the studies, they will have to pay at the full cost of the service all the meals enjoyed from the day after the graduation date. The sanction envisaged by the canteen service regulation will also be applied.

The forfeiture also applies to students who move to another university or cease studying. Any meals after the date of transfer or renunciation will be charged at the full cost of the service. The sanction envisaged by the canteen service regulation will also be applied.

Students who attend the filter semester in Milano-Bicocca, will lose the canteen benefit if they do not continue the second semester in the same university.

DEFINITIONS

For the purpose of assigning the right to education benefits, the meaning is:

Beneficiary: the student who meets the merit and the economic requirements is the beneficiary of the scholarship.

Eligible non-beneficiary: the student who, although possessing the requirements of merit and income, fails in obtaining a scholarship due to lack of funds.

Partial beneficiary: the student receiving the benefit in the amount of 50%. This is the condition of students enrolled in the first year outside prescribed time and students, enrolled in the first academic year, who meet the ex-post merit requirements only by November 30 2027.

Beneficiary under condition: the student who, although possessing the requirements of merit and income, has not completed yet the enrollment procedure in the a.y. 2026/2027 before the day of the publication of the final ranking due to the following reasons:

- Student waiting for the enrollment in Ph. D programs, in Specialisation Schools or in the first year of the master's degree and single-cycle master's degree of Faculty of Medicine and Surgery.
- Student waiting for the award of the qualification of the previous level of studies, if enrolled in the first year of the master's degree, in Ph. D programs or in Specialisation Schools.
- Non-UE student waiting for the study visa.

First absolute enrollment: first enrollment in any degree programme (including a different degree programme from the one attended in the a.y. 2026/2027) with the same admission title of the same level of studies for which the student is enrolled for the a.y. 2026/2027, in any Italian or foreign University, regardless of the outcome of this career (cessation of studies, transfer, award of degree, etc.).

ISEE: ISEE for facilitations for the right to university education issued pursuant to art. 8 DPCM 159/2013 and in favour of the student who requests the benefits provided for by the announcement.

Student with disability: students with a disability pursuant to article 3, paragraph 1 or 3, of the law n. 104 of 5 February 1992, or for students with a disability of 66% or more.

EXAMPLES

1. ACADEMIC REGULARITY

(paragraph [3.1.1](#) and [3.1.2](#))

Examples of academic careers that, pursuant to paragraphs [3.1.1](#), [3.1.2](#), cause the non-eligibility for the scholarship or the special calculation of the minimum number of required credits.

1. Enrollment in the first year of a Bachelor's degree in the a.y. 2025/2026 in any Italian or foreign university and subsequent withdrawal from studies.

The student with this previous academic career will not be entitled to the scholarship in the academic year in which they repeat the enrollment in the first year of any Bachelor's degree or single cycle master's degree, regardless of whether they have already received the scholarship for that year or not.

2. Enrollment in the first year in a Bachelor's degree in a.y. 2024/2025 and enrollment in the second year in a.y. 2025/2026, with subsequent enrollment in a.y. 2026/2027 in the first or second year.

The student with this previous academic career will not be entitled to the scholarship in the academic years in which they repeat the enrollment in the first year or second year of any Bachelor's degree or single cycle master's degree.

3. Enrollment in the first year in a Bachelor's degree in a.y. 2024/2025 and subsequent transfer from another university to Milano-Bicocca in a.y. 2025/2026, with repetition of the first year.

The student with this previous academic career will be entitled to the scholarship in a.y. 2026/2027 only if they are allowed to enroll in the second year and achieves a minimum number of credits, calculated with reference to all the years of enrollment in both previous academic years (in this example, credits for the third year are required).

The list only gives some examples and is not exhaustive.

2. ACADEMIC REGULARITY – PRE- UNIVERSITY EDUCATION AT FOREIGN SCHOOLS

(paragraph [3.1.2](#))

- 11-year foreign education cycle → one year enrollment in a University of the country of origin.

The student who falls under this category can declare that they have no previous academic registration in Italy or abroad.

- 11-year foreign education cycle → enrollment for two or more years in a University of the country of origin.

The student who falls under this category CAN NOT declare that they have no previous academic registration in Italy or abroad, since the duration of the foreign academic registration exceeds the minimum to reach the 12 required years.

3. PROPORTIONAL CRITERION

(paragraph [3.2.2](#) and [3.3](#))

The merit requirement is calculated by the following formula (an example for a Bachelor's degree):

$$\text{minimum credits} = \frac{35}{60} * \text{maximum credits}$$

N.B.: the values 35 e 60 are only examples and they must be appropriately modified according to the year for which the requirement is calculated.

3. WEIGHTED AVERAGE

(paragraph [3.5.2](#))

To calculate the weighted average it is necessary to multiply each mark by the value (in credits) of the exam; the sum of these results must be divided by the total number of credits considered.

Example:

exam 1	mark 26/30	value: 9 credits
exam 2	mark 30/30	value: 12 credits
exam 3	mark 18/30	value: 8 credits
exam 4	mark: approved	value: 3 credits
total credits achieved		32 credits
total credits considered for the weighted average		29 credits

Calculation of the weighted average:

26 x 9 =	234 +	
30 x 12 =	360 +	
18 x 8 =	144 +	
total	738	weighted average: 738 / 29 = 25,45

4. CALCULATION OF THE INTERNATIONAL MOBILITY INTEGRATION

(paragraph [6.2.1](#))

Example of application of the calculation for integration for international mobility:

- International mobility from March 1 2027 to September 3 2027;
- Amount received from European Union and University: 3.360,00 euros;
- Place: Europe;
- Months calculated for integration 6,10;
- Months calculated for meal refund: 5,10 (no canteen service in August);
- Gross integration amount: 600,00 euros x 6,10 = 3.660,00 euros
- Net integration amount: 3.660,00 – 3.360,00 = 300,00 euros (*zero in case of negative value*);
- Amount for the meals: (829 euros / 11 months) x 5,10 months = 384,35 euros
- Amount for the travel expenses: 100,00 euros;
- Total integration amount: 784,35 euros

CHECKS ON THE ACCURACY OF SELF-DECLARATIONS

1. CHECKS

The application for all the benefits provided by the University is submitted by the student using the self-certification option in accordance with the D.P.R. 445 of December 28th 2000.

In order to verify the data declared in the self-certification (in terms of merit, income, and travel time), the University makes use of the options established by the current provisions of law, in particular the Decree of the President of the Republic of December 28th 2000, n. 445. The University can also require from students any documentation that can be useful to verify the veracity of the declarations, pursuant to art. 4, paragraph 7 of Legislative Decree 109/98 and of art. 4 paragraph 10 of the D.P.C.M. April 9th 2001.

In agreement with the Revenue Agency, Regional Directorate of Lombardy and Ministry of Finance, the University carries out formal and substantial checks of the veracity of self-certifications produced by students, using the databases of the Revenue Agency and the Territorial Agency, as well as the Registered Office of Municipalities or any other Public Administration holding the self-certified data. The University may also make use of the assistance of the Guardia di Finanza, reserving the right to report situations that require further investigation or in-depth analysis.

Pursuant to art. 2947 of the Civil Code, the checks will be carried out within 5 years after the last undue use of benefit connected and consequent to the self-certification that turned out to be untrue.

2. CONSEQUENCES IN CASE OF NON-VERACITY

In case of verification of untruthful declarations, the sanctions established by the art. 10, paragraph 3 of Legislative Decree 68/2012 will be applied. In the event of omissions relating to the economic condition, the additional sanction pursuant to art. 38, paragraph 3, D.L. 78/2010 will be applied.

2.1. Sanction pursuant to art. 10, paragraph 3, Legislative Decree 68/2012

For each verified untruthful declaration, the student will have to pay the following amount as penalty pursuant to art. 10, paragraph 3 of Legislative Decree 68/2012:

- a. if the non-veracity involves the total loss of the benefit, three times the benefits granted both monetarily and in the form of services;
- b. if the non-veracity involves the partial loss of the benefit, three times the sum equal to the difference between amount of the benefit granted and/or the used and the amount of the benefit due.

In particular, with regard to the housing service, the penalty amounts will be calculated as follows:

- c. in the event of forfeiture caused by verification of untruthful declarations about achieved merit requirements: three times the difference between the preferential tariff and the € 350,00 tariff;
- d. in the case of forfeiture caused by verification of travel times of less than 90 minutes: three times the difference between the preferential tariff and the € 350,00 tariff set by the service provider;
- e. in the event of forfeiture caused by verification of untruthful self-certified economic data or in the case set out at letter b) of point 11.1: three times the difference between the preferential tariff and the € 350,00 tariff.

In addition to the above, the student loses the right to obtain other disbursements for the entire duration of the studies.

This applies without prejudice to the adoption of disciplinary sanctions and the denunciation to the judicial authorities in the case of a criminal offence (Article 331 of the Italian Civil Code).

2.2. Sanction pursuant to art. 38, paragraph 3, D.L. 78/2010

In the event of detection of non-veracity of the economic condition, in addition to the sanction mentioned at the previous point, the penalty pursuant to art. 38, paragraph 3 of the D.L. 78/2010 is applied. This penalty ranges from € 500,00 to € 5.000,00 and is determined according to the current University Regulations in proportion to the unduly received benefit.

Read carefully "[Regolamento per la disciplina dell'applicazione delle sanzioni](#)".

3. EXCLUSIVE COURT

For any dispute concerning the present Announcement, or resulting from its application, the exclusive court will be that of Milan.

GENERAL NOTES

The present competition is announced, both for the scholarship and for the housing service at preferential tariff, pending the implementation of Legislative Decree 68/2012, in compliance with the provisions established by the law of the Lombardy Region of December 13 2004, no. 33, art. 3, by the decree of the President of the Council of Ministers of April 9, 2001 (as required by Article 8 of Legislative Decree 68/2012). The call is published in accordance with the Decree of the Ministry of University and Research n. 1320 of December 17 2021, the related circular n. 13676 of May 11 2022, the Decree of the Ministry n. 933 of August 2 2022, the decision of the Regional Government of Lombardy N. XII/ 6298 of 15/06/2026 "Determinazioni in merito ai criteri ed alle previsioni di finanziamento per l'assegnazione dei benefici a concorso per il diritto allo studio universitario - anno accademico 2026-2027" and the Decree of Ministry n. 447 of July 11 2025.

As a consequence of the memorandum of understanding of July 19 2010 between Lombardy Region and the Ministry of Education, this announcement acknowledges the criteria for the experimental assignment of the benefits for the students enrolled in the first and in the second year of Bachelor's Degree and of single cycle master's degree programmes for the academic year 2026/2027.

This contest is financed by the Lombardy Region and by the MIUR. The University reserves the possibility to provide for the entitled students additional funds, allocated from its own budget, necessary to expand the range of students beneficiary of scholarship, compatibly with the granting of the above-mentioned loans.

This contest is financed by the contributions allocated by MIUR, by the Lombardy Region and by the funds made available by the University.

The scholarship is free from income tax as provided by the circular of the Ministry of Finance no. 109 / E of April 6 1995; however, the "Certificazione Unica" of the amounts disbursed in cash and in free services will be issued.

The benefits governed by this announcement can be assigned to students who in the academic year 2026/2027 are enrolled in the degree programmes of the University of Milano-Bicocca and meet the **merit**, **economic** and **academic regularity** requirements specified in the sections dedicated to to each benefit.

In the sections concerning the housing service, the canteen service and the exceptional subsidy, for all the information that is not expressly provided, please refer to the scholarship announcement.

The data will be processed in accordance with Legislative Decree June 30 2003, n. 196 ("Code regarding the protection of personal data") and its subsequent amendments and additions, as well as the EU Regulation 2016/679 (General Regulation on Data Protection or, more briefly, GDPR).
